## PRESENTATION

Production activities and all organizations have operated in recent decades within a context characterized, at least since 2008, by accelerated structural changes, difficult to control and manage, and by increasing uncertainty. So much so that the very notion of "control" today sounds almost inappropriate. It is necessary to learn how to read the context, anticipate the directions of transformations, and position oneself in a way that guarantees resilience and prosperity for organizations. Without this ability to read the environment, companies and institutions are condemned to suffer the changes already shaping our present: from climate change to technological advances, from demographic trends to the uncertainties of globalization.

This Strategic Foresight master's program, "Future & Foresight. Methods of anticipating the future for companies and institutions," promoted by **Ca' Foscari Challenge School of the University Ca' Foscari Venice** and developed in **collaboration with** an internationally renowned partner in the field of future studies, the **Copenhagen Institute for Futures Studies**, is designed to meet the needs of Italian organizations facing the challenges posed by an increasingly uncertain, complex, and evolving global context. The project aims to train professionals skilled in understanding long-term dynamics and in the main methods of strategic foresight, capable of driving profound changes in the strategies of the organizations in which they operate.

## OBJECTIVES

The Master aims to provide participants with advanced skills and methodological tools that enable them to:

- a) interpret the context and evolutions in future scenarios;
- b) anticipate changes that impact their own business/organization;
- c) formulate anticipatory strategies to gain competitive advantages;
- d) integrate a culture of anticipation within their own organizations.

The Master aims to train executive, managerial, and middle management profiles in public and private companies and institutions, equipped with the ambition and ability to participate in the processes of defining and changing the strategies of the organizations they are or will be part of; strategic consultant.

## SYLLABUS

### STRUCTURAL CHANGES, ANTICIPATION, AND FUTURE STUDIES

The course aims to introduce students to the Master's perspective by creating a common language that presents the study of long-term dynamics of structural change in the economy and society. It also introduces methods of future anticipation, applying them in a practical and directly applicable way to decision-making contexts for companies and institutions. On one hand, it provides an introduction to the concept of structural change in scientific literature and to public/private strategies aimed at managing structural changes. On the other hand, it covers the history of future anticipation methods and the main scientific evidence regarding their use within organizations.

### METHODS OF STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

The course aims to provide participants with knowledge of some of the main methods of Strategic Foresight, in particular: Systems Thinking, Horizon Scanning, Scenario Planning, Environment Scanning, 7 Questions Interview, Three Horizons.

### MEGATRENDS AND THEIR IMPACT ON BUSINESSES AND PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS: DEMOGRAPHY, CLIMATE, AND TECHNOLOGY

The aim is to illustrate the concept of "megatrends" and "megathreats"; to identify the main megatrends shaping the near and distant future; to introduce the lifecycle of megatrends; to frame the present at the convergence of five megatrends; and to understand the impacts on specific sectors, with particular reference to the effects of climate change, demographic dynamics, and recent technological revolutions.

## MEGATRENDS AND THEIR IMPACT ON BUSINESSES AND PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS: INDUSTRY, WORK, AND GLOBALIZATION

The aim of the teaching is to illustrate the concept of "megatrends" and "megathreats"; to identify the main megatrends shaping the near and distant future; to introduce the lifecycle of megatrends; to frame the present at the convergence of five megatrends; and to understand the impacts on specific sectors, with particular reference to the dynamics of industrialization/deindustrialization, changes in the labor market, and trends in the international economy.

## APPLICATION OF STRATEGIC FORESIGHT IN COMPANIES AND INSTITUTIONS

The course aims to provide practical experiences and case studies of applying Strategic Foresight to strategic thinking and planning in both public and private organizations, as well as to innovation processes. It also illustrates the concept of anticipatory leadership, relating it to relevant corporate case studies.

## DURATION AND ACADEMIC CREDITS (CFU)

The Master's program has a one-year duration and includes:

- **301 hours of teaching** (in blended mode)
- **250 hours of project work**
- **1600 total hours of academic engagement**, including individual study and project work development
- **64 academic credits (CFU)** awarded

## QUALIFICATION ISSUED

Students who have attended the teaching activities, completed the internship, passed any intermediate assessments, and the final exam will be awarded the **second-level Master's degree in Future & Foresight. Methods of anticipating the future for businesses and institutions.**
